Cracked It is an innovative social enterprise which trains young people aged 14-24 to repair cracked iPhone screens as a positive alternative to gangs and crime. Thus far, thanks to support from EECF, Cracked It has delivered nine Bootcamp programmes reaching 62 young people.

EECF hosted a Philanthropy Club event in March and were delighted to have Cracked It as our special guests. Cracked It's Chief Executive Josh Babarinde explained how thanks to the collective generosity of East End Community Foundation's Philanthropy Club and the Allen and Overy Ben Ogden Memorial Fund, the social enterprise has been able to grow and develop.
